Our focus is: Multiplication and Division, Fractions and Decimals, Time, Position and Data You can help at home by:

- Making groups of items—we have 4 groups with 5 lollies in each
- Sharing objects equally amongst the family such as food, toys, cards
- Help with the cooking and measure things out like half a cup of milk, cut items in half such as fruit and vegetables
- Play games that involve left and right such as marching, turning. Also giving directions to an on object such as under the table
- Point out the times of events that occur in your day to day routine. Oh, you're going to bed at 7 o'clock. Look at the hands of the clock
- Counting and recording in a tally how many times they can do something.

Home Reading

Your child will also be sent home a take home reader to read every night. One book title is to be written in the yellow recording log each night. During the reading you can ask your child questions such as 'what do you think will happen next?' 'which part of the story did you like the most?' and 'which character was your favourite and why?'.

Sight words need to be read each night. If your child can read the words confidently, they can then write them out and put them into sentences. They could also make games such as memory and your own version of snakes and ladders. Children can create stories and discuss with you opposites and synonyms (words that mean the same but are different eg. hot / warm).
