In English, we continue to improve upon our success in various tasks, including peer reading, phonemic awareness, writing, and home reading. All students have a positive attitude toward English and meet the high expectations that I have of them as learners. Each week, we introduce a quality text to enjoy and examine, and our writing skills have become stronger as we develop the skills to plan, write, and edit our texts.

Mathematics is the most anticipated part of our day and includes number talks, which are an essential ignition activity for our lessons. Students have become more proficient in articulating their strategies in answering a variety of maths questions. Flexibility with numbers is an important foundational skill in number sense and algebra. The more students practice this skill, the more confident they will become in mathematical thinking.

In Science, we have had enormous fun learning about light and sound, digital technology, and physical sciences. A recent highlight was participating in a series of experiments for our Science unit, Machine Makers, which led to investigations of pushes, pulls, ramps, levers, and pulleys. Lots of interesting learning and very engaged and excited learners.

1/2 Newton also has the expertise of Mrs Vassel, Mrs Fisher, and Miss Cummings who teach Literacy, Sport and Fundamental Movement Skills each week. Our wonderful librarian, Ms Green's lessons are another highlight of the week for students too. My sincere thanks to Miss Parry for teaching 1 / 2 Newton whilst I was absent. She did an amazing job.
