How is everyone feeling after such an exciting term? Having to learn about Wadalba Community School and settle into Kindergarten for the first time has been thrilling and a little bit daunting for everyone. The students have done a magnificent job of learning the class and school routines and expectations. I adore the eager, smiling faces every morning ready to learn something new.
