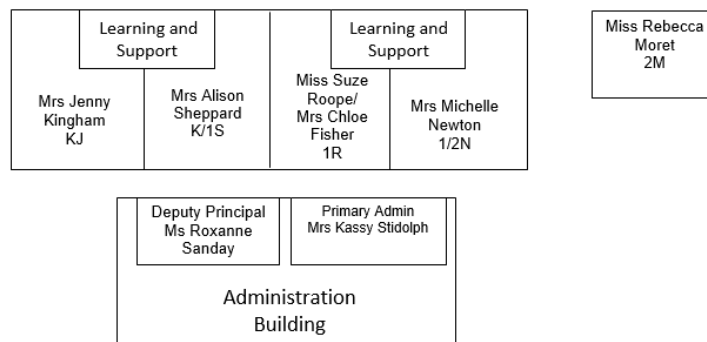
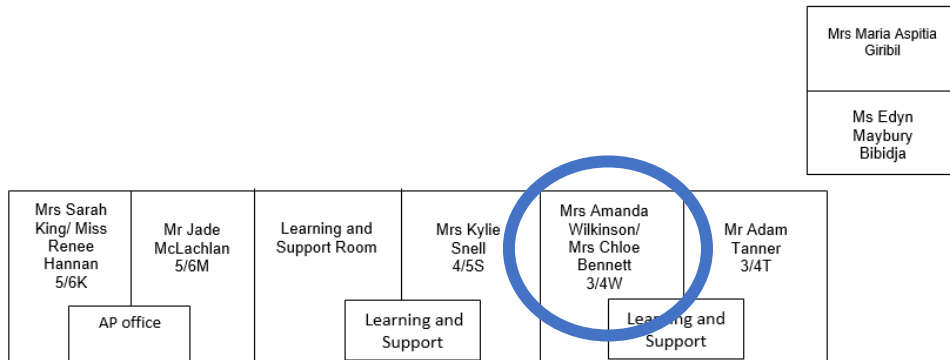

# WCS Class Information



## Parent/ Teacher Interviews in Week 6

- We will be hosting a Parent/ Teacher interviews on **Tuesday March 4<sup>th</sup>**. We have moved this back to the start of the year based on feedback from families and staff. More information will be sent out about this shortly. Families will be able to book timeslots online for this evening.
- Outside of set parent interview nights, if you ever wish to request a meeting, these are best arranged at mutually convenient times and when I am not on class. Send me a Class Dojo message if you need me to call you or to arrange a meeting.
- If I ever have concerns or questions about your child I will contact you through Class Dojo, via phone or in person.

## Homework and Home Reading

1) *Home Reading*: Students should read for at least 15 minutes each night. Regular reading at home has a huge positive impact on many aspects of student learning, beyond just literacy development. Stage 2 students can borrow home readers or library books, or read their own texts from home. We strongly encourage students to fill out their home reading card to keep track and receive their certificates/rewards. Home reading cards will be checked, signed and dated by classroom teachers every week.

2) *Mathematics*: Students should complete assigned Maths Online tasks each week. These tasks will complement and reinforce teaching in the classroom. They include video tutorials, interactive questions



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based explicitly on the video tutorial, weekly revision, problem solving and/or extension activities. Teachers will monitor student progress to identify strengths and where there might be some gaps in knowledge.

Login details will be provided via Class Dojo.

● **While the expectation is that all students will complete homework and home reading, we do not want it to cause tension/stress so please speak to me if you have any questions or concerns.**

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## **Notes and money (SchoolBytes Portal)**

### Excursions or Incursions

- Notifications regarding school activities and excursions are emailed to parents using the SchoolBytes platform. Please ensure the email that you have on file with the front office is up to date and checked regularly. Emails regarding events will include a link to give consent (or opt out) for an activity and then to make payment. You can login to the SchoolBytes payment portal at any time to check if there are activities requiring permission or payments due, and access your payment history.

### Absences

- Students are expected by the Department of Education to attend school over 90% of school days. If absent, an explanation of an absence must be received within 7 days of your child's return otherwise it is recorded as an unexplained absence. Partial absences must also have an explanation. Please send a note to school with your child when they return after an absence stating the dates and reason for which they were away. You can also call the school or explain the absence by replying to the absence text sent to your mobile.

## **Illnesses**

- Please contact the school if your child has a highly contagious infection such as COVID, chicken pox, measles, whooping cough, or any other contagious illness. Please notify the school immediately if you receive a positive COVID result for your child.

## **Birthdays**

- You may send small birthday treats to school to share with the class. Cupcakes or individually wrapped treats are preferred. "Birthday Buckets" of ice blocks are also available for purchase through the school canteen.
- Please let me know if you would like to opt your child out of birthday treats brought from home or the canteen.

## **Healthy Eating and Fruit Break**

- About 9:30am each morning we encourage all students to snack on some fruit or vegetables and a drink of water. Please send a piece of fruit or a chopped vegetables to eat at this time. Students are also welcome to keep a drink bottle containing water in the classroom. Alternatively, there is a water chilling station outside the Stage 3 rooms with a bubbler. Crunch 'n' Sip is an initiative of the NSW Health Promotion team, designed to help students meet the national nutrition guidelines.
- At Wadalba we support healthy eating at school as it has been shown to have a positive impact on student engagement and learning. Please ensure your child has nutritious food for recess and lunch each day.



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## Canteen

- Lunch orders can be placed in the lunch basket (in the classroom) each day Mon- Fri. You may also like to setup an account and order via the internet at <https://schoolshoponline.net.au> . Our primary canteen is typically open at each day at recess or lunch but this should not be relied upon for student recesses or lunches as it depends on the availability of volunteers. To guarantee food, please place a lunch order.

## Uniform

- Please ensure all school clothing is clearly labelled with your child's name. Black shoes must be worn unless there are special circumstances (a note must be provided). Sport shoes can be worn on Sport Days. Hats MUST be worn by all students as part of our Sun Safety Policy.

## Drop Off/ Pick Up

- Students may be dropped off at school at the dedicated Primary gate adjacent to our "Kiss and Drop" zone.
- There is no supervision for students before 8:00am each morning. Please do not send your child to school earlier than this.
- If collecting your child, please wait under the COLA area and away from the classroom until the 2:30pm bell rings. Parents outside the classroom can be distracting to the students who are trying to pack away ready to go home.

## Assembly

- Primary assemblies are held in Week 5 and Week 10 at 12:00pm. These are led by our student leadership team and include 2 class performances.
- I will let families know when it is our turn to perform.

## Sport

- Sport will be on **Friday** each week. It is vital that students have a hat on sport days and they are encouraged to wear sunscreen.

## Labels

- Please ensure that all of your children's belongings are clearly labelled. Though we do our best to prevent it, no responsibility will be taken by the school for lost items. All items found without labels can be claimed from lost property.

## Classroom Helpers

- We are always welcoming of volunteers to support the programs within our classroom. We will also request assistance later in the year from any parents/carers who wish to assist in organising the Year 6 Farewell. Please contact me if you are interested in helping in any way.
- There are opportunities to assist in other areas of the school such as P&C fundraising, canteen



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volunteers, book club, making costumes for performances and other areas as they arise throughout the year. Please let us know if you are interested so we can get the right people to contact you.

## Class Dojo

- We use the digital platform ClassDojo to reinforce classroom behaviour and to communicate directly with parents. Parents and carers are able to join ClassDojo and use either the app (Android or iOS) or website to see how their children are going and to communicate with the teacher.
- If you have connected to ClassDojo before you should soon be connected automatically to your child's new class. If you have not used it before or have another child starting school, details about how to connect to your child's account will be sent home. **Please note: any absence notifications or urgent messages (such as changes to pickup arrangements) need to be communicated via the school office as teachers will not always be able to check ClassDojo throughout the day.** Similarly, teachers will only respond to messages outside of business hours at their discretion.

## School communications

- ClassDojo is the primary method of communication with families



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- Notes are sent home to inform parents of special events.
- A school newsletter is placed on the website and emailed to parents/carers fortnightly. This contains school news, a calendar of events and other items of interest.
- Information can also be found on Wadalba Community School's Facebook page and website.
- Parent information sessions are held from time to time to discuss specific issues relevant to different groups.
- Parents receive formal student reports at the end of each semester.
- Primary teachers are usually in their rooms after school for varying periods of time. Teachers are unable to speak to parents during class time.
- Parents are encouraged to contact the school to discuss concerns or raise questions relating to their child when the need arises.
